Thank you for attending RAC bstreetsmart

RAC bstreetsmart exposes students to the realities of road trauma. The realistic nature of the event can be confronting for attendees and RAC recommends a student debrief is facilitated in the days following the event. This discussion guide and our online resources are designed to assist you.

Themes and messages to discuss following the event

- The far-reaching and long-lasting effects of road crashes and how road trauma can not only have an impact on you, but on the people around you and the wider community you live in.
- How peer pressure can influence decision making behind the wheel as a driver and passenger.
- Where to seek help in understanding and coping with the realities of road trauma (teacher, school counsellor or chaplain, parent/guardian, [Road Trauma Support WA](#) etc.).
- Consider strategies that will help you make safe decisions in the future.
- How a parent/guardian can support you in making safer decisions on the road.

Discussion questions

- How did the event make you feel?
- Why do you think RAC, WA Police, St John WA and the Department of Fire and Emergency Services wanted you to see this event?
- Discuss the characters from the re-enactment. Which characters can you relate to and what could they have done differently to change some of the outcomes?
- What strategies can you implement to be a safer driver or passenger?

- Students watch a series of short clips from a crash re-enactment docudrama.
- Accompanying resources encourage students to reflect on the decisions made by the characters in the film.
