



## How can teachers use RAC bstreetsmart?

RAC bstreetsmart aims to educate Year 10 - 12 students on the importance of road safety and the dangers of risk-taking behaviour. RAC recommends that schools attending RAC bstreetsmart also engage in additional road safety education in the classroom.

## Link to RAC's free education programs, resources, and events

RAC provides free road safety education to secondary schools across Western Australia in the form of workshops, presentations, and online resources. Presentations and resources cover a range of road safety topics, with the aim of educating the next generation of drivers on how to stay safe on the roads as both drivers and passengers. RAC's free education programs can be tailored to suit each year group.

Our On the Roads program is a free in-class road safety education program suited to Year 10 - 12 students. The program is designed to keep students safe on the roads by influencing risk reduction, increasing resilience, and encouraging responsible behaviour.

We also offer free online resources that teach students about the importance of safe driving and being a responsible passenger, as well as the effects of alcohol, speed, reckless behaviour and driver inattention.
