Fatal factors on the road - Speed

1. Stop.

5. Combination of reaction time and braking distance.

9. Ideas may include - slow down if you are the driver, as a passenger be proactive to ensure the car is travelling at a safe speed, drive with proper space between you and the car in front, etc.
