Introducing the new inductee to RAC's Walk of Fame

RAC recognised the distinguished professional career of Dr Ken Michael AC today by adding his name to the RAC Walk of Fame as part of its 110 year anniversary celebrations.

RAC President Esme Bowen said the Walk of Fame, located outside the RAC's West Perth office, acknowledges those who have made a significant contribution to transport and road safety in Western Australia.

"Dr Ken Michael AC, a former Governor of Western Australia, has worked tirelessly in his field for better mobility in WA. His extensive work on bridges, road design, construction and management is to be commended," Ms Bowen said.

"His paver will join those laid in RAC's centenary year which recognised the industry's pioneers and advocates."

Dr Michael's notable career spans more than 40 years and includes, but is not limited to, Patron of RAC, Commissioner of Main Roads WA, Chairman of the East Perth Redevelopment Authority, Member of the Economic Regulation Authority and Chancellor of the University of Western Australia.

Dr Michael will share the Walk of Fame with Professor Gordon Stephenson who is widely acknowledged as the 'father of the freeway system'.

Road infrastructure visionary Dr Michael said he was honoured to be acknowledged for his contribution to the industry.

"I am humbled that RAC, a well-respected WA member organisation, has chosen to include me in their Walk of Fame," Dr Michael said.

Dr Michael AC will be the seventeenth person to be inducted into the RAC Walk of Fame since its launch in 2005.
